Our participation in Round Square Conferences globally has put us on the world map. The elevation of Mr Russelljeet Singh Khatra as Round Square Regional Rep for South Asia & Gulf Region has indeed catapulted PPS into a different league altogether. We broke new ground when we sent 5 of our students for an Educational Exchange-cum-Round Square Conference at St Andrew's School, Boca Raton, Florida this year. The increasing participation of our students in Social Service Projects under the aegis of the Round Square has further steeled our resolve to take service activities to the next level. To provide medicare to the needy in the surrounding villages has been our prime focus. We have expanded it to include orphanages and old age homes. We are indeed thankful to Vice Admiral Soni for having spared time from his busy schedule to be amongst us for our 56th Founders' Dayfunction.

Vice Admiral Satish Soni (R-121) joined The Punjab Public School, Nabha in 1965 and passed out in 1971. After Schooling, he secured admission in IIT, Delhi but left to join the National Defence Academy in August 1972. He represented the Indian Navy in Squash and Golf.

As an Admiral, he continued to excel and has held the most challenging of appointments including

Flag Officer Commanding Eastern Fleet, Chief of Staff of the Eastern Naval Command, Commandant of the National Defence Academy, Deputy Chief of Naval Staff and Flag Officer Commanding-in-Chief of the Eastern Naval Command. He is presently the Flag Officer Commanding-in-Chief of the Eastern Naval Command since June 2014.

Shri K N Singh, President, Executive Committee of the School Board of Governors passed away on October 15, 2015. He served the School in varied capacities since 1983. During these 56 years, the school has made its mark among the best residential schools of the country and has also contributed immensely to the civil services, law, politics, media, industry and other professions. Let me bring to the notice of the august gathering that the School hosted the ONA Golden Jubilee Celebrations in April 2015 which was attended by many Old Nabhaites from India and abroad.

Ladies and gentlemen! The school is highly indebted to its patrons who have been a source of immense help from time to time.

I would now like to make a mention of some of the contributions made by the Old Nabhaites.

I am thankful to the Silver Jubilee Batch of 1989 for

taking the responsibility of relaying of the entire Junior School Boarding Corridors.

We are also truly humbled by the highly benevolent gesture of ex-Chief of Army Staff, General Bikram Singh, PVSM, UYSM, AVSM, SM, VSM, ADC for presenting the Inter-Wing Challenge Trophy for the Best Wing in NCC (JD) and presenting to School four War Trophies which are now placed on the campus. We are equally indebted to Vice Admiral Satish Soni, recipient of the Roll of Honour this year for gifting to the institution the models of a ship and a submarine. Besides, Vice Admiral Satish Soni has also instituted a **Cup for the Most Improved Child** in Class-XII which will be awarded next year.

Academics

I am pleased to inform you that the student of The Punjab Public School, Nabha have once again kept the school flag high by showing excellent results in ICSE (X) and ISC (XII) Board Examinations conducted by the Council for the Indian School Certificate Examinations (CISCE), New Delhi.

In ISC (Science Stream), Surkhab Kaur stood first with 98.75% marks followed by Harshil Sharma and Shubham Garg with 97.50% and 96.50% marks respectively. Out of 32 students who appeared for the ISC exams (Science Stream), 30 got distinction.

In ISC (Commerce Stream), Onkar Singh Jassar stood first with 94.25% marks followed by Hritika Birdi and Harshdeep Kaur with 93.75% and 92.25% marks respectively. Out of 78 students who appeared for the exams, 56 passed with distinction. In ISC (Humanities), Inayat Kaur Sohi stood first with 89.3% marks followed by Akashdeep Singh Virk and





Tammana Bhadauria with 85% and 82.3% marks respectively. Out of 9 students who appeared for the exams, 6 passed with distinction.

In ICSE (Science Stream), Vanshika Mangla stood first with 95.4% marks. Smiley Mittal, Arushi Gupta and Jashanpreet Kaur stood second with 95.2% marks each. Ameya Batra stood third with 95% marks. Out of 93 students who appeared for the exams, 86 passed with distinction.

In ICSE (Commerce Stream), Anmoldeep Kaur stood first with 89% marks followed by Gurteerath Singh Brar and Ankita Delu with 87% and 86 % marks respectively. Out of 42 students who appeared for the exams, 27 passed with distinction.

Jaspreet Kaur, Mandeep Singh Chahal and Prabhdeep Singh Waraich in ISC and Arushi Gupta and Jashanpreet Kaur in ICSE made a perfect score of 100 in Computer Science and Computer Application respectively.

Surkhab Kaur made a perfect score of 100 in Mathematics in ISC (12th Class).

Surkhab also brought laurels for PPS Nabha by securing Overall 1st Position in Punjab and 3rd Position All Over India by securing 98.75% marks in ISC Science Stream.

It is pertinent to mention here that there is no Second/Third Division in the entire 10th & 12th Classes and all students passed their examination with either Distinctions or First Divisions.

Squash

We overcame Modern School, Delhi and made it to the Semi-Finals. We lost to Mayo College, Ajmer in the Semi-Finals. We played the Hardline Match with Doon School, Dehradun and scored a thumping

victory bagging third position in IPSC.

Roll of HONOUR

Vice Admiral Satish Soni (R-121) joined The Punjab Public School, Nabha in 1965 and passed out in 1971. During his years in school, he remained rather small built and inconspicuous but was good at academics, dramatics, gymnastics and table tennis. He signed the 'Honour Book' for academics every year.

After Schooling, he was admitted in IIT, Delhi but left to join the National Defence Academy in August 1972; a decision he never regretted, as a career in the Navy offered him the opportunity to travel, seek adventure in day-to-day work, and hone his leadership skills.

On commissioning, Satish was adjudged the best all-round Midshipman and was awarded the Sword of Honour. His initial assignments were onboard frontline Fleet Ships, including a secondment to the Government of Mauritius to man their warship and train their men. He was also the Flag Lieutenant (ADC) to the Chief of the Naval Staff in 1984-86. He

specialised in Navigation, Operations and Direction and, in 1987 at the age of 31, he was selected to undergo training in the USSR and commission an ocean going minesweeper in Riga as the first Commanding Officer of the ship.

He graduated from the Defence Services Staff College, Wellington in 1989 and served in Naval Headquarters in the Directorate of Personnel responsible for Human Resources Development in the Navy. He was selected to command the indigenously built Corvette, INS Kirpan in 1994-95, and thereafter served in the sensitive Directorate of Plans, responsible for budgeting, force structuring and foreign cooperation.

In 2000, he was selected to go to Russia for the state-of-the-art stealth frigate of the Navy. He commissioned the first ship of the class, INS Talwar, as the Commanding Officer in 2003. This was followed by yet another command of the missile destroyer, INS Delhi in 2005.

Satish represented the Indian Navy in Squash and Golf.

In 2006, he was promoted to the Rank of Rear Admiral and was appointed in the Personal Branch as the Assistant Chief of Personnel (Human Resource Development).

As an Admiral, he continued to excel and has held the most challenging of appointments including Flag Officer Commanding Eastern Fleet, Chief of Staff of the Eastern Naval Command, Commandant of the National Defence Academy, Deputy Chief of Naval Staff and Flag Officer Commanding-in-Chief of the Eastern Naval Command. He is presently the Flag Officer Commanding-in-Chief of the Eastern Naval Command Since June 2014.

During his career, he has received many awards including Commendation by the Chief of the Naval Staff in 1992, Nau Sena Medal for Devotion to Duty in 1996, the Presidential Award of Ati Vishist Seva

Medal in 2006, and the highest Presidential Award of Param Vishist Seva Medal in 2013.

He writes on defence matters, and has contributed to many defence journals. He has lectured at the Army's College of Combat, Defence Services Staff College, College of Air Welfare and College of Defence Management and has participated in many conferences on defence-related subjects.

For achieving exceptional distinction in life and doing alma mater proud, the Roll of Honour is conferred upon him for the year 2015.



Act today, Change tomorrow

The Round Square International Conference-2015 was hosted by the United World College of South East Asia, Singapore. Prior to the conference, the school delegation led by Mr Russelljeet Singh Khatra, the school RS Rep and six students-Vishavjeet Singh Virk, Rishi Jindal, Gurpreet Singh Sidhu, Gurjeeven Singh Brar, Manpreet Singh Dhaliwal and Gurbhej Singh Dhaliwal also attended an educational and cultural tour to the historic city of Malacca in Malaysia. Given below is the day-to-day account of the tour:

Pre-conference tour to Malacca (Malaysia)

The school delegation landed at the Changi International Airport, Singapore late in the evening on September 28, 2015, where they were received by Mr Jimmy Sim, the official representative from Eurotours Private Limited, a prominent travel company that had organised the pre-conference tour in association with the host school, UWCSEA Singapore. A total of 6 Round Square global schools had registered for the pre-conference tour. Other schools that were part of the group were MLC, Sydney, Transylvania College, Romania, Bishop's College School, Canada, Indian School, Oman and The Doon School, Dehradun. The delegation checked in at Fort Canning Lodge for the overnight stay. After a tiring road journey from Nabha to New Delhi and the flight to Singapore, our group still had the energy for some late evening local exploring. We visited a prominent Chinese mall adjacent to Dhobi Ghaut Metro Station (Indian culture is deeply embedded in Singapore and its influence is ubiquitous. Even the name Singapore has Indian roots - Singa from Singh, i.e. Lion and pore is a modification of the common Indian suffix pur" which means a city or settlement. Interestingly, however, there are no lions to be found anywhere in Singapore!)

Day 1 (September 29, 2015)

The group set off for Malaysia in two luxury coaches after early breakfast. It was a hazy morning with low visibility. Mr Jimmy explained that haze in



Singapore has become a serious problem in recent years. The forest fires in Indonesia to create agricultural land annually result in a heavy blanket of smog that seem to be spreading to other regions of South East Asia with each passing year. The haze was a recurrent theme throughout the Conference. After entering Malaysia via Johor Immigration and Customs clearance, we set off for a long and scenic journey through rubber and palm plantations. We reached Malacca (Melaka in native language) and checked in at Hotel Hatton. Malacca is rich in history and culture. Spanning a period of 600 years, it was a Malay kingdom under the Chinese protection, and then under the Portuguese, followed by the Dutch and the British, and finally made part of Malaysia. Today Malacca is a world heritage site. On day 1, we visited some local houses with traditional architecture, and were introduced to the legendary "Hang Tuah", a prominent warrior in Malaysian folklore.

Day 2 (September 30, 2015)

After a traditional Malaysian breakfast, we set off to explore the rich heritage of Malacca. We started off with Christ Church and Malacca Museum in the colourful town square thronged by beautifully decorated native rickshaws. We climbed up the Saint Paul's hill and visited the spot where St Paul was originally buried (his body was later transferred to Goa, where it currently rests). The next destination was the ruins of Portuguese Fort, Porta De Santiago. Not much remains of the splendour of this once imposing bastion of the Portuguese might. After packed lunch, we walked all the way to the famous Jonker Street and savoured the sights and smells of the bustling Malaccan market. In the evening, we visited the Baba Nyonya Heritage Museum that gave us a first-hand glimpse into the life of a Baba Nyonya family (Baba means a Chinese man, and Nyonya, a local Malay lady). Baba Nyonya community is the wealthiest community in Malacca.

Day 3 (October 1, 2015)

On the final day of our pre-conference tour, we set off for a boat ride on river Malacca. It was quite an experience and provided an interesting glimpse into the life of this unforgettable Malaysian city. We were also lucky to spot and photograph a Monitor lizard en route, and saw some beautiful murals painted on the buildings along the cruise route. The last item on our itinerary was a visit to Harmony Street where we visited a mosque, a Hindu temple and a Chinese temple that is supposed to be the oldest in South East Asia. After some shopping and lunch, we finally checked out of Hotel Hatton and set off for our return journey to Singapore. We bade farewell to Desmond and Joe, our wonderful tour guides who inspired us to appreciate museums and taught us the art of developing a keen eye for the history, culture and heritage of a place. Late in the evening we returned to Fort Canning Lodge at Singapore.



October 2 was the official arrival day for the Conference. Since we had time, we decided to visit the National Museum of Singapore. It provided us a great insight into the short but eventful history of this city-state. Singapore is a true melting pot of cultures dominated by the Chinese, and to some extent by Indian culture as well. We reached the United World College of South East Asia (Dover Campus) and registered for the event. Our host families picked us up and made sure that we felt at home.

Over the next five days, we were privileged to attend lectures by three eminent keynote speakers - adventurer Tim Jarvis, social activists Kavita Ramdas and Nidhi Kapur. We were especially impressed and inspired by Tim Jarvis. Tim Jarvis, AM is an environmental scientist, adventurer and author with a Masters degree in environmental science and environmental law, and is a Senior Associate - Sustainability at Arup. His environmental work is mainly focused on sustainable aid provision in developing countries and improving corporate environmental sustainability. Jarvis says he is *committed to finding pragmatic solutions to global environmental sustainability issues" and as a public speaker he talks regularly about motivation and leadership to both individuals and organisations. He is best known for his Antarctic expedition of 1999, undertaken with fellow Australian explorer Peter Treseder. As a result, for a few years, he was the Joint World Record holder for the fastest unsupported journey to the Geographic South Pole and the longest unsupported Antarctica journey.

We were also lucky enough to meet Mr Shiv Khemka, a business tycoon who has a family connection with the erstwhile Nabha royal family. He was delighted to meet us and informed that all his three daughters were students at UWCSEA, Singapore. He also addressed the student delegates at one of the student riikas

In addition to the exhilarating barazza sessions, we thoroughly enjoyed our excursions both with our fellow delegates and with our host families on the "Discover Singapore Day". The host families pampered us beyond imagination and we had no words to express our gratitude for the love and affection shown to us.

On October 8, 2015, we returned to India after a memorable Round Square experience. We truly understood that in order to change tomorrow and make the world a better place to live in, we need to act today, immediately and urgently.
















Day-2








Delhi Trip
