
From the Headmaster's Desk

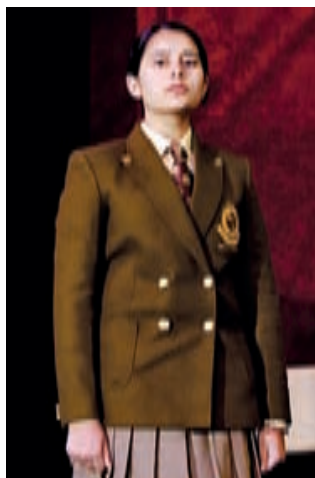
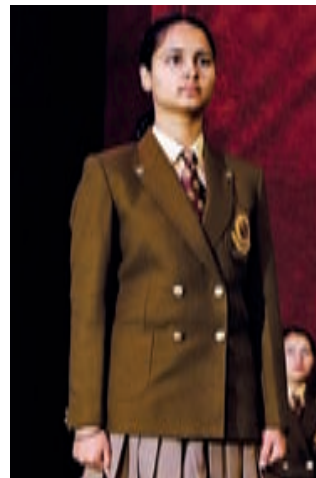
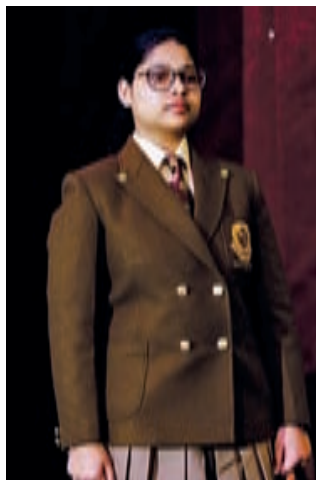
Oath Taking Ceremony School Appointments take charge

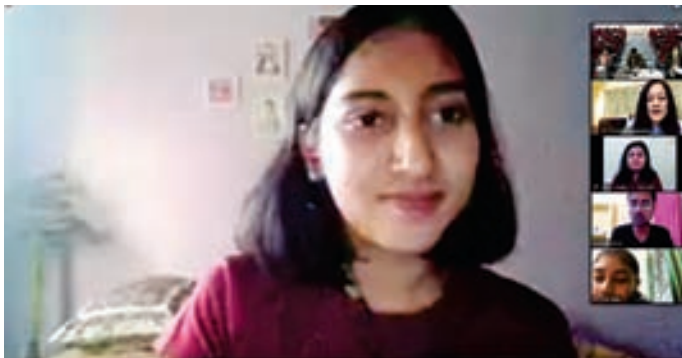


REVEALING EMOJI-CAMBRIDGE STUDENTS VENT THEIR FEELINGS

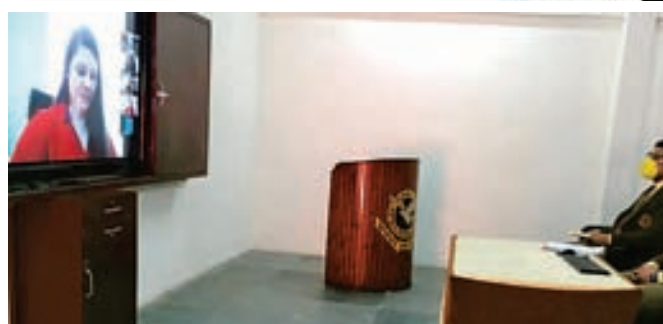
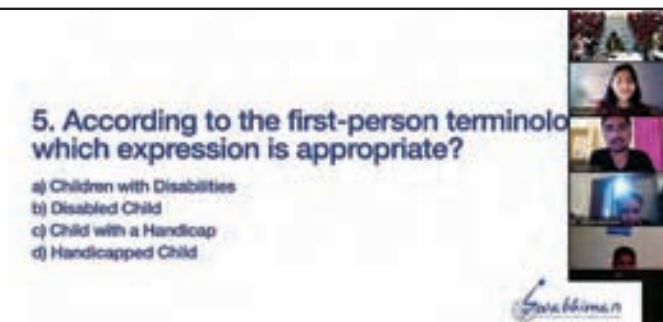

Demographics

Over a billion people live with some form of disability. This corresponds to about 20% of the world's population. Between 1.5 and 2 billion adults have very significant difficulties in functioning.

More than 20 percent of 200 million or more thousand kids of people are born with any or more disabilities. In Colombia, for most people with disabilities, it is between 60-70 years. Those people are often excluded from the others, are the poorest and face many barriers, including physical discrimination and that in attitude.

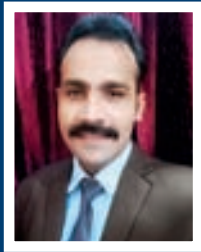

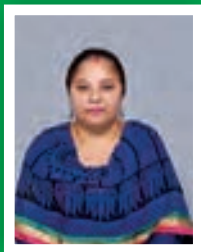

Lord Krishna as Sanathana Sarathi (Eternal Charioteer)

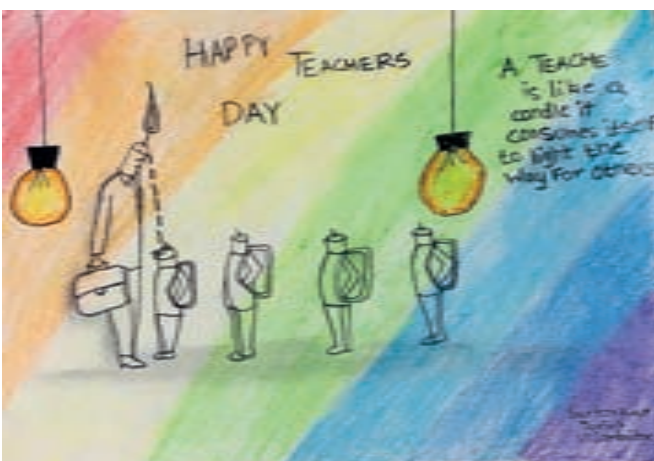

There are two birds sitting on one tree, the Upanishad says, the Jivatma (Individual Soul) and the Paramatma (Supreme Soul), on the tree of this Body, this World. One bird eats the fruit of that tree, while the other simply looks on, as a witness. Teacher's Day celebrations

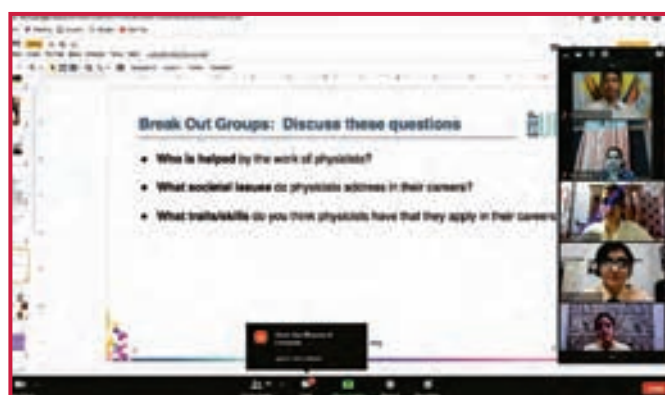
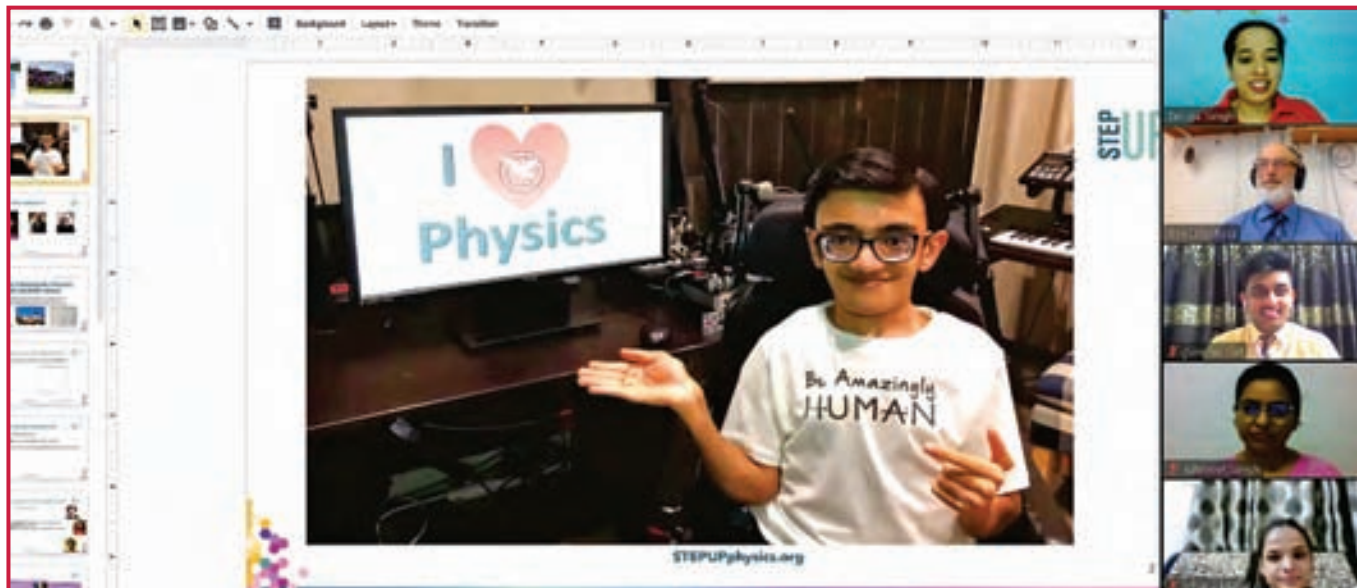
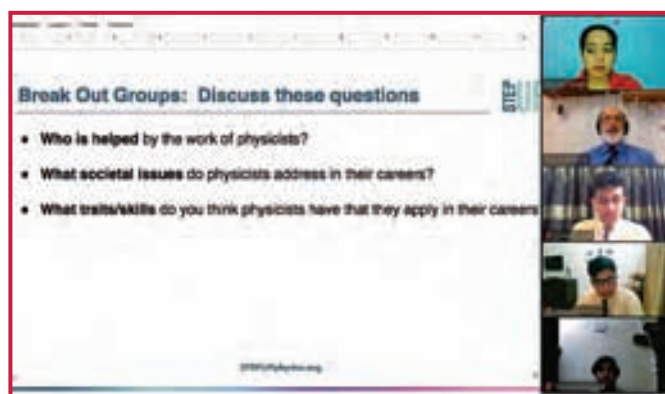

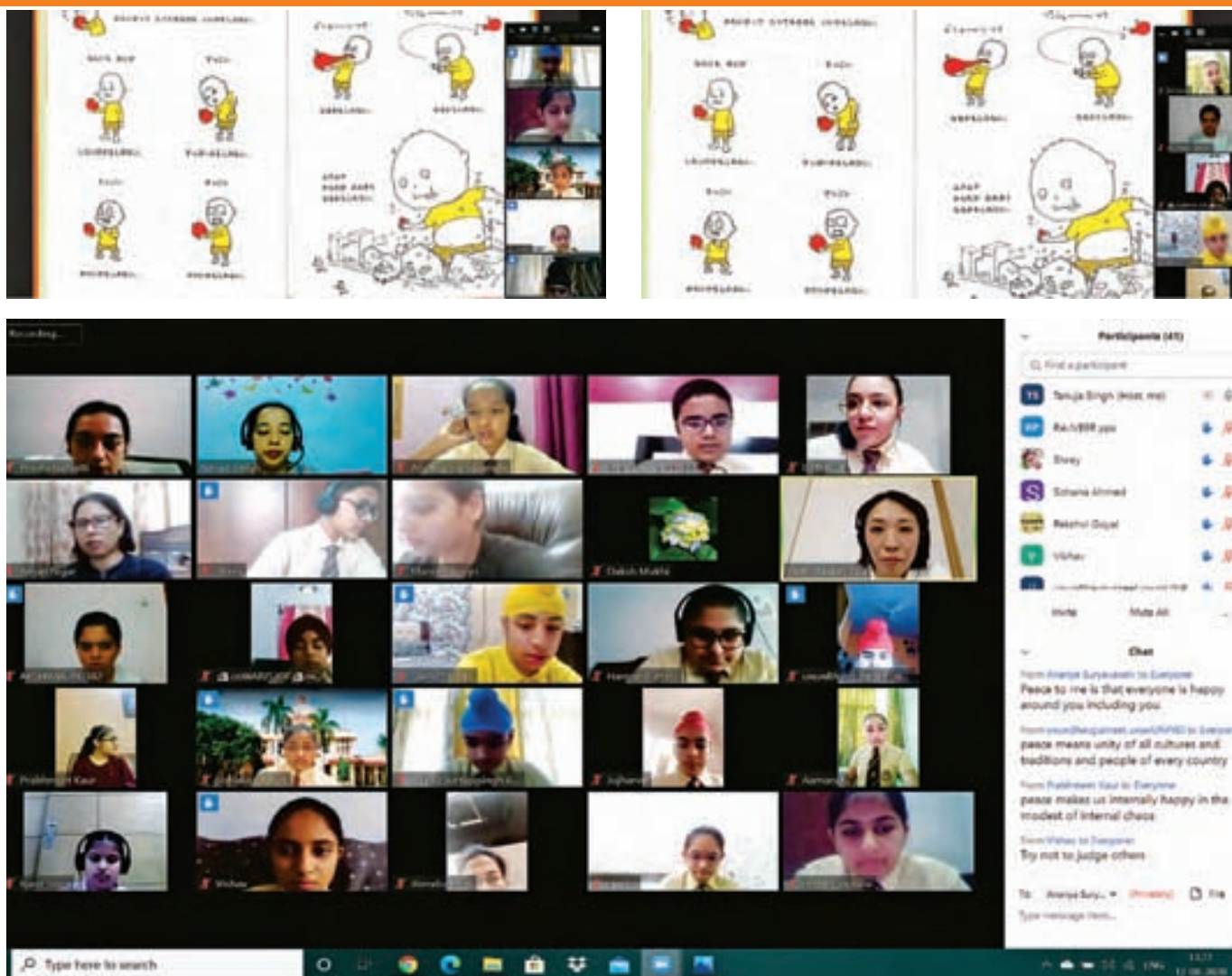




Career options in Physics

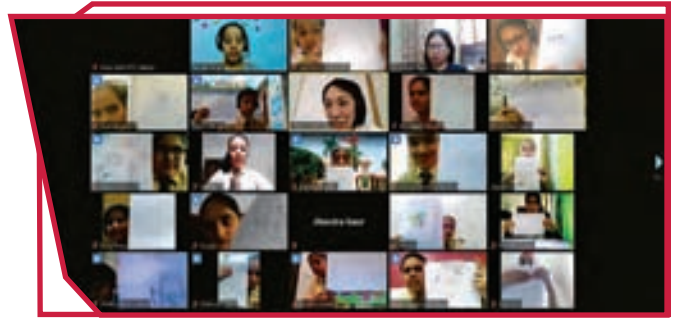
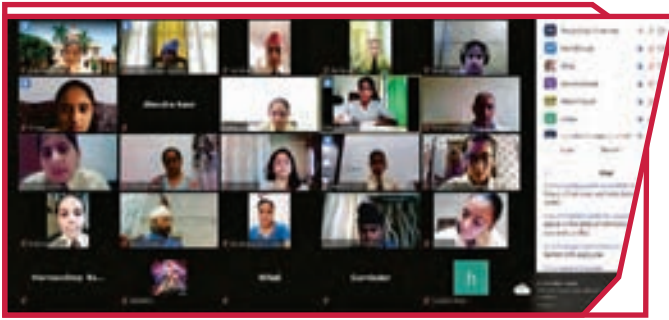


Ms Chiho connects from Tokyo Talks perception and peace

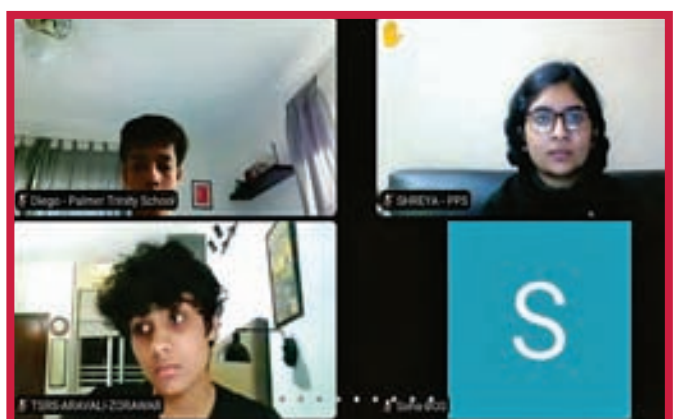
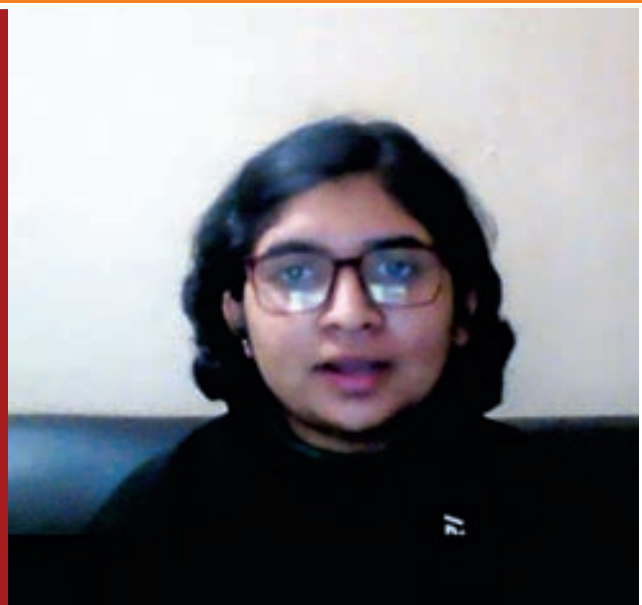
Doon School hosts Round Square Postcard Zoom Session

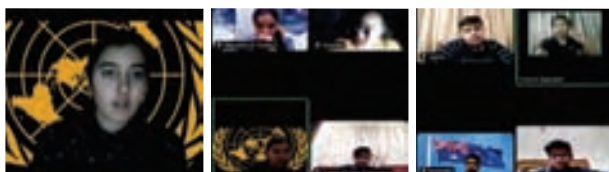

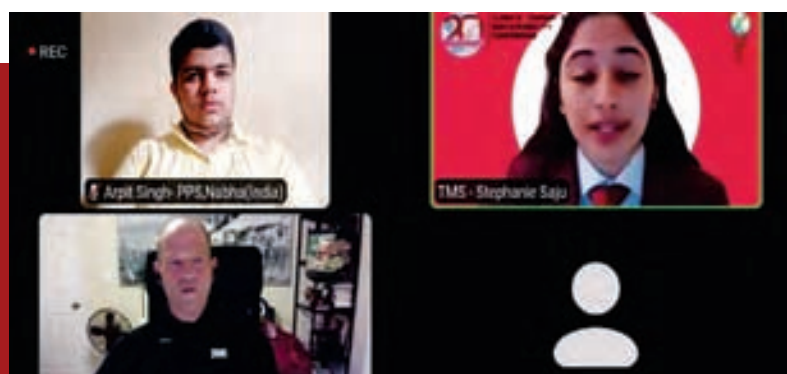
The Millennium School Virtual Conference 2020

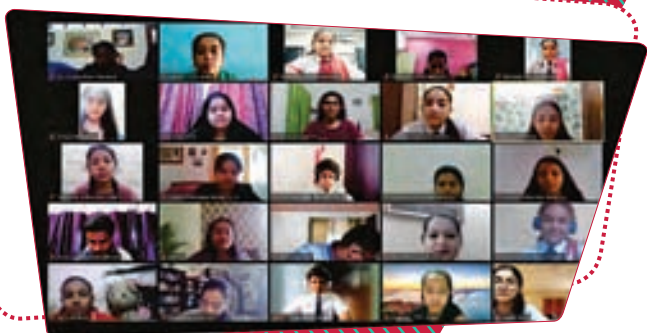

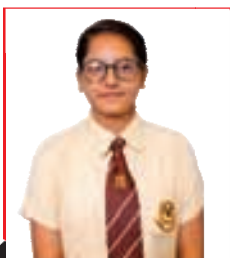

The Council for the Indian School Certificate Examinations (CISCE), New Delhi declared results for ICSE and ISC on July 25, 2021. Pramita Ranu from ISC (Humanities) topped district Patiala with a whopping 99.8% marks.
